Joseph L Duckworth was born on November 18, 1916. According to our records <u>Mississippi</u> was his home or enlistment state and <u>Jones County</u> included within the archival record. We have <u>Ellisville</u> listed as the city. SERVICE

He had enlisted in the United States Army Air Forces. Served during World War II. Duckworth had the rank of First Lieutenant. Service number assignment was O-422653. Attached to 64th Troop Carrier Squadron, 403rd Transport Company Group. CASUALTY

During his service in World War II, Army Air Forces First Lieutenant Duckworth experienced a critical situation which ultimately resulted in loss of life on <u>June 7</u>, <u>1943</u>. Recorded circumstances attributed to: <u>DNB - Died Non-battle</u>, air crash. Incident location: <u>Laurinburg-Maxton AAB</u>, North Carolina.

DETAILS

Joseph "Joe" L Duckworth was the son of Lester Lamar Duckworth and Bertha Virginia Hester.

On June 7, 1943 he was onboard the Douglas C-47A #42-23512 that took off from Pope Field on a night transport flight to Laurinburg-Maxton AAB in North Carolina. They encountered severe weather and crashed within a few miles of their destination. There were no survivors among the crew and over a dozen glider pilot passengers.
